COVID-19

From Mid-March - June 2020, McQuaid Jesuit transitioned to distance learning as a result of COVID-19. Our grading policy remained intact and students received numerical grades for marking periods 3 and 4.

GRADING POLICY

Grading is numerical with Advanced Placement and advanced courses receiving a 4% weight in the final average for the course. McQuaid Jesuit does not rank its students for internal or external reporting. The minimum passing grade is 70.

Due to the rigor of our core academic courses, students are not allowed to take more than three (3) Advanced Placement classes during a school year without permission from our Dean of Academics.
