Scholarship honors class of '87 grad

The friends of a Marine captain who was killed in November 1991 when his Harrier AV-8B jet crashed during a routine training flight over Spain have established a scholarship in his memory. The Thomas P. Driscoll Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to a needy undergraduate, who will know the source of his or her support and something of Driscoll's ideals.

Family was an important part of Driscoll's life. At the time of his death, he was preparing for a trip home to Rochester, N.Y., to spend Christmas with his parents, brother and sister. He was also thinking about a family of his own; he was engaged to classmate Anne Regan '87—they would have been married on Valentine's Day of this year.

Friends describe him as one of those rare individuals who left an impression on those he met. Friendly, outspoken, idealistic, imbued with a strong sense of social justice, he viewed life as an opportunity to live out one's dreams and to touch the lives of others in a positive way. While at Villanova, Driscoll was a volunteer for the Special Olympics Fall Festival held on campus and viewed such activities as a chance to give something of himself to others. He was also a highly

motivated individual who believed in expanding the boundaries of what he could accomplish, as evidenced by the two Marine Corps marathons he ran.

The Rochester, N.Y., native graduated from McQuaid Jesuit High School. In his four years at Villanova, he served in the Marine ROTC and received the American Defense Preparedness Association ROTC Award during his senior year. He graduated with a degree in electrical engineering and was commissioned as a Marine officer. His dream of flying jet airplanes was realized during his four and a half

years in the military. According to his superiors, Driscoll was a superb pilot; they said that his next assignment would have been squadron flight trainer.

Driscoll was eager to return to his hometown of Cherry Point, N.C., where he would be reunited with his brother, Dan, a Marine first lieutenant who recently returned from a one-year tour of duty in Okinawa, Japan. Both Tom and Dan followed in the footsteps of their father, John, who was an Army officer in the early 1960s.

Driscoll believed that people can make a difference. By supporting the Thomas P. Driscoll Memorial Scholarship, fellow Villanovans can pay tribute to that ideal and help a deserving student.

Thomas P. Driscoll, Marine

Marine Capt. Thomas P. Driscoll of Brighton died Monday, Nov. 11, 1991, when his military jet crashed during a training mission in Spain. He was 26.

The U.S. Navy is currently investigating the crash.

Capt. Driscoll was on a Mediterranean cruise aboard the *USS Wasp* as part of the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit.

He was stationed at Cherry Point Marine Corp Air Station in Havelock, N.C.

Capt. Driscoll was a 1983 graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School and a 1987 graduate of Villanova University with a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering.

Capt. Driscoll graduated with honors from the Marine Officer's Basic School at Quatico, Va., in November, 1987.

He was commissioned a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps in May, 1987, and promoted to captain on Oct. 1, 1991.

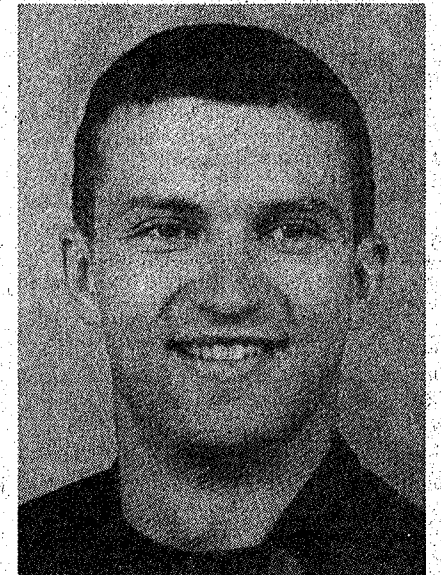
He was designated naval aviator and earned his wings at Chase Naval Air Station in December, 1989.

Dear Mr and Mrs Driscoll,

I was not privileged to know your son well. Although we were both assigned to the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit, we served in different commands. While he was assigned to the composite squadron, I serve with the ground combat element of the unit. I made his acquaintance at the beginning of this deployment and occasionally exchanged pleasantries with him. He was well respected and greatly admired, and enjoyed an enviable reputation as a Marine, pilot, and, most importantly, as a man. He is sorely missed in our ranks.

My purpose in writing is to inform you of a memorial service that was conducted for him of which you may not be aware. In addition to the well attended ecumenical service that was conducted aboard the USS WASP on the 15th instant, a like service was held at Camp Sotomayor, Almeria, Spain on the same day. A large part of Battalion Landing Team 3/8 trained with the X Bandera (battalion) of the Spanish Legion at the camp from 8 through 16 November. As we could not attend the shipboard ceremony, we conducted a separate one at our bivouac site at the training camp.

At our evening planning meeting on 14 November, we scheduled the memorial service for 1830 (6:30 PM) the following day. My guidance to subordinate unit commanders was that attendance was to be encouraged but not mandatory. Later that night, at our daily coordination meeting with the Spainards, we were invited to attend a celebration of the completion of our week long training with them scheduled for the same time and date as the service. We respectfully declined their kind invitation and they offered their condolences.

At about 1815 on the 15th while standing near the wind swept field where the service was to be held, I noticed our infantry companies on the march from the training areas moving toward the memorial service site. While they were coming from the east, other formations of men were converging on the field from the north. The sun had long set, but in the twilight I could see the men in the latter formations were wearing the distinctive headgear of Spanish Legionnaires. As the Marine and Spanish formations reached the dusty field and aligned themselves, a helicopter landed about 200 meters to the south and about a half dozen men disembarked. Included in this group was The Commanding

Officer of the 26th MEU and MEU Sergeant Major. They had attended the memorial service for your son aboard the USS WASP earlier that day and had come to join us in our service for him. Every Marine not on watch elected to attend the service to remember and bid farewell to our fallen brother in arms. The attendance of the Spanish troops was completely unexpected but most welcome. Indeed, we had not invited them because we were concerned they might feel obligated to attend. It was the only time I saw the Legionnaires wearing their traditional caps - clear testimony they considered the service a most important event. The X Bandera numbered over 200 and there were about 500 of us. The masses of men in ranks was an awesome sight. Once they were formed, the only sound that could be heard was that of pennants and unit colors snapping in the cool stiff night breeze.

I assume from your names that you are Roman Catholic. If so, you will be interested to learn that the chaplain who conducted the service was Father Jindra, a diocesan priest from St. Louis. The readings were typical of a requiem Mass. I can't recall what they were nor do I remember what Father Jindra, our Battalion Landing Team chaplain, said during the homily. I remember praying part of a rosary for him and imploring the Blessed Virgin Mother and my late wife to welcome him to eternal paradise. Had you been able to attend, I think you would have been moved and most pleased with the service. I hope my description of the event is some consolation to you in your time of great sorrow.

You and your fine son will continue to be remembered in my prayers. May you find comfort in the knowledge he is now in the heavens he loved so well, and may his soul and all the souls of the faithfully departed rest in peace.

PRESS RELEASE

Marine Captain Thomas P. Driscoll, 26, of Brighton died when his A/V8-B Harrier jet crashed while on a low level training flight near Vilagràcia De Le Torre, Spain at approximately 11:00 a.m. local Spain time on November 11, 1991. All the details of the mishap are not known at this time. Mishaps of this nature are required to be fully investigated.

Captain Driscoll was on a Mediterranean cruise aboard the USS WASP as part of the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit. He was stationed at Cherry Point Marine Corp Air Station in Havelock, North Carolina attached to the Marine Attack Squadron 223 detachment.

Captain Driscoll was a 1983 graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School and a 1987 graduate of Villanova University with a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering. He was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the Marine Corps in May 1987 and promoted to Captain on October 1, 1991. Captain Driscoll graduated with honors from the Marine Officer's Basic School at Quantico, Virginia in November 1987. He was designated a naval aviator and earned his wings at Chase Naval Air Station in December 1989.

Captain Driscoll is survived by his parents John P. and Patricia (Grady) Driscoll; a brother 1st Lieutenant Daniel F. Driscoll^{USMC}; a sister Meaghan P. Driscoll; his fiancée Anne D.
